MACA will use California's existing energy strengths to reopen safe production, support refinery supply, and keep more jobs and energy dollars inside the state while pursuing realistic pump-price relief.

- 1. Put safe California wells back to work.** MACA will prioritize inspection, maintenance, and lawful reactivation of safe existing wells so California makes better use of production assets it already has.
- 2. Increase in-state output with realistic targets.** MACA will push for measurable growth in California barrels through workovers, field services, and better coordination instead of making impossible promises.
- 3. Create jobs in energy counties.** MACA will support work in Kern County, along with other counties to the Los Angeles Basin, Contra Costa, and related logistics corridors through operations, trucking, maintenance, fabrication, and inspection.
- 4. Keep California refineries better supplied.** MACA will align production and refinery needs where technically feasible so more California crude stays in California and dependence on foreign imports is reduced.
- 5. Lower prices honestly.** MACA will pursue steady pump-price relief by reducing import exposure and supply shocks while acknowledging that taxes, refinery limits, and fuel rules also affect prices.
- 6. Strengthen energy security.** MACA will keep more payroll, vendor spending, and tax base inside the state while making California less vulnerable to global supply disruptions and foreign volatility.
- 7. Publish quarterly production and price results.** MACA will issue a public dashboard showing production, jobs, refinery supply, and retail trends so Californians can judge the plan by facts, not slogans.
